General Tips for Developing Important Pre-Reading Skills in young children infancy through age five.

- Engage young children in conversations. Talk about your day, what you are doing and what is going on in your environment.
- Share read alouds, sing songs and make up stories.
- Use sophisticated vocabulary words in conversations. Explain new words and teach child the names of objects in your environment.

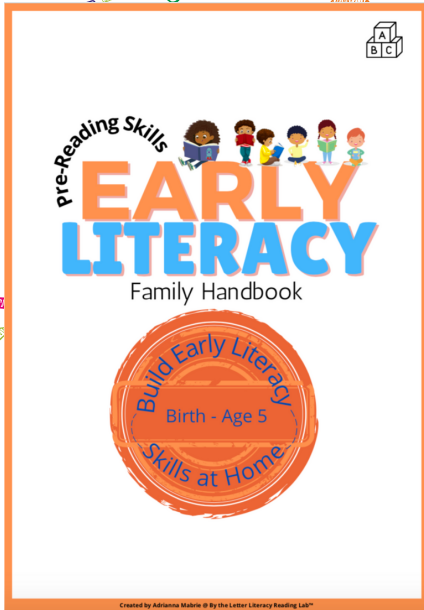
