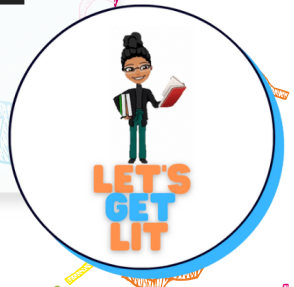

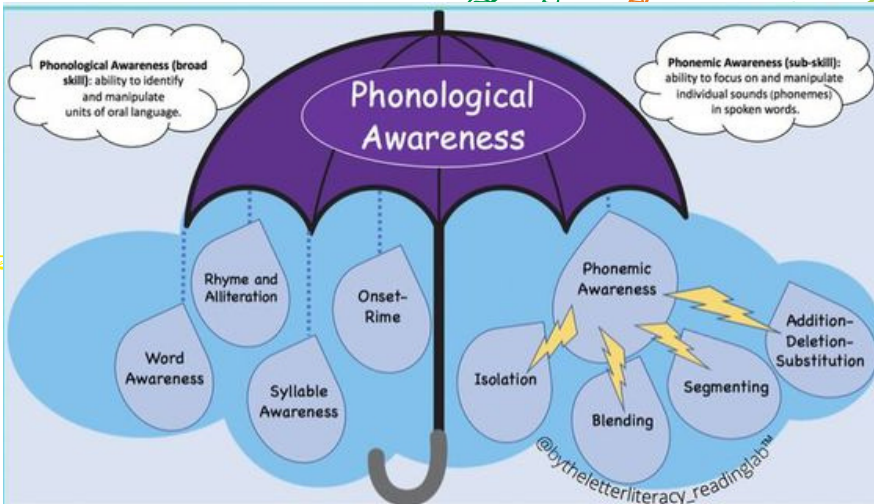

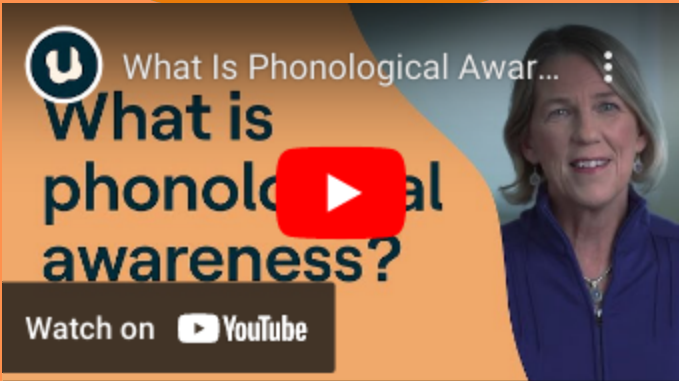


HELPFUL TIPS

Help develop your child's phonological awareness:

- Read books that feature rhyming words.
- Make up stories/poems using alliteration. ex. Bobby baked bread for Betty.
- Play I Spy games with sounds: ex. I Spy something that begins with /b/
- ! For this game, be sure to say the sound, not letter name
- Count words in sentences..
- Clap out syllables in name/words

Beginning Sounds/Rhyming Riddles

Q. What starts with /f/ and rhymes with dish?

Q. What starts with /h/ and rhymes with cat?

Q. What starts with /d/ and rhymes with log?

- Try to come up with your own riddles, and play throughout the day at mealtime, in the car, bath time etc.
- When you see a letter represented this way /b/ you should say the sound and not the letter name.

Say the name of the picture.

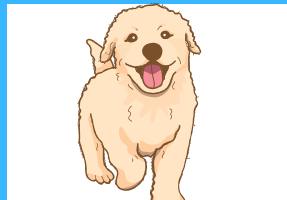
What sound do you hear at the beginning?
